Gravestone Cleaning Do's & Don'ts

- 1. "Do no harm" to the cemetery ro gravestone you are cleaning. Always leave the area better than you found it. Remove trash/debris.
- 2. Do not clean a stone without receiving permission from family or caretaker of cemetery before proceeding. Also check your state laws.
- 3. Survey stone for stability & deterioration issues before cleaning. If it moves, leave it alone. It may not be safe to proceed until it Is reset and/or repaired.
- 4. If there are signs of sugaring, flaking, fractures....do not clean the stone.
- 5. Never use a power washer on any stone. If is like sandblasting it. Can cause years of surface deterioration immediately. This is especially true for older ones.
- 6. Do not use bleach or household chemicals on stones. Many are highly alkaline (ph13) and can eat away at the stone from the inside out.
- Use only soft bristle brushes. Do not "scrub" the stone. Let the D2 Biological Solution do its job. Usually takes several weeks to receive the full benefits of this product.
- 8. Gently clip/remove vines from stone. Never "yank" them. Their roots could be deep within the stone. Removing them harshly can cause breakage.
- 9. Never use wire brushes or scrapers on the stone. To remove lichens, use only plastic scrapers or wood craft sticks.
- 10. Only clean stones that are in dire need of preservation.
- 11. After cleaning granite stones/monuments, dry with a clean white cloth. Do not use one that has been laundered with fabric softener.
- 12. Contact a professional if in doubt of any of the above.

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
